Information for incoming exchange students

Autumn term	1 August 2015 – 31 December 2015 Classes: 7 September 2015 – 19 December 2015
Spring term	1 January 2016 – 31 July 2016 Classes: 4 January 2016 – 28 May 2016
Orientation	The orientation days for new international students are organized in the beginning of September (autumn term) and in the beginning of January (spring term).
Languages of instruction	Finnish, English, Swedish. Best possibilities to study in English are on the Master's level. Preferred level in English: B2 / IELTS 6,5 / TOEFL 92 / or equivalent.
Studies	<p>The School of Science offers courses for exchange students in:</p> <p>Computer Science Industrial Engineering and Management Engineering Physics Mathematics and Operations Research Biomedical Engineering and Neuroscience Special Minor Programmes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Aalto Ventures Programme (AVP) - Multi-Disciplinary Energy Studies (MES) - Aalto Nuclear Safety Minor (ANS) <p>Apart from a few exceptions, exchange students can freely join all courses organized by the School of Science. Most of the courses offered in English are on Master's level but as an exchange student you can take courses at any level if you fulfill the prerequisites of the course. All projects, workshops and other events organized at Aalto University are equally open to exchange students. Grading system	From 0 to 5 with 0 being failed, 1 being the lowest passing grade and 5 the highest. Some courses are only graded on a scale of pass/fail.
Application process	Contact first your home university exchange coordinator. Students who are nominated by their home university coordinators will receive a link to an online application by email together with detailed instructions on how to submit the application. Application deadlines	For full academic year and autumn term: April 30 For the spring term only: October 15 The Letter of Admission will be sent within one and a half months after the deadline.

Accommodation for exchange students	Furnished rooms for incoming exchange students are available through two student housing providers, HOAS and AYY. The student apartments are located in Espoo and Helsinki, all with good public transportation connections to the university campus. Accommodation costs	Student housing: 200-400 €/month (water, internet, electricity included) Private accommodation: 400-700 €/month (water, internet, electricity not included) <i>Please note that we cannot guarantee student housing for all exchange students!</i>
Living costs	In addition to accommodation, the average living costs are around 500 €/month including meals, transportation and personal expenses. Student union membership fee is 56 € for one term and 114 € for academic year.
Residence permit	Students from most non-EU countries need a residence permit for Finland which they need to obtain before arrival. EU/EEA-citizens register their stay in Finland after arrival.
Health Insurance	EU/EEA-citizens should take the European Health Insurance Card with them. Students from non-EU countries need a private health insurance covering their stay in Finland. More info: http://www.aalto.fi/en/studies/about/for_future_student/visa_and_immigration/
